Robuchon au Dôme Retains the Highest Black Diamond Rating for the Fourth Consecutive Year as Five SJM Restaurants Are Honoured at Trip.Gourmet's 10th Anniversary Awards

(Macau, 8 September 2026) Robuchon au Dôme of SJM Resorts, S.A. has retained the Black Diamond rating of Trip.Gourmet's 2027 Global Restaurant Selection, the highest tier awarded by Trip.Gourmet and held by only four restaurants in Macau, for the fourth consecutive year. It was one of five SJM restaurants honoured today at the "Trip.Gourmet's 10th Anniversary Edition: Restaurant Rankings and Fine Dining Awards Ceremony." Palace Garden and The Eight received Diamond ratings, and Don Alfonso 1890 and Mesa by José Avillez received Platinum.

SJM's five award-winning restaurants this year are:

- Robuchon au Dôme: Awarded the highest Black Diamond honour for the fourth consecutive year, remaining one of only four restaurants in Macau to achieve this elite tier.
- The Eight: Awarded Diamond, recognised by the Selection for the fifth consecutive year.
- Palace Garden: Awarded Diamond for the fourth consecutive year.
- Don Alfonso 1890: Awarded Platinum, recognised by the Selection for the fourth consecutive year.
- Mesa by José Avillez: Awarded Platinum for the third consecutive year.

Since its launch in 2016, Trip.Gourmet has grown into the dining guide of Trip.com Group, one of the world's largest online travel companies and the operator of Ctrip in mainland China. Its selection was rated by Trip.com together with chefs and food-culture specialists on five criteria: restaurant quality, luxury of experience, popularity, diner ratings on the platform, and the standing of the city. Within the fine dining list, Black Diamond is the highest tier, followed by Diamond, and Platinum.
