**SJM Theodore Racing Clinches  
2025 Lamborghini Super Trofeo Asia Championship**

*Team Concludes Season on Global Stage at Lamborghini Super Trofeo World Finals in Italy*

(Macau, 13 November 2025) SJM Theodore Racing, supported by SJM Resorts, S.A. (“SJM”), has been crowned 2025 Lamborghini Super Trofeo Asia (LSTA) Champion, marking another milestone in Macau’s motorsport history. The final round of the series took place in Misano, Italy, where the team sealed the overall Drivers’ and Teams’ Titles with two races to spare — a feat that underscores its dominance throughout the season.

Representing the team were Macau’s Charles Leong Hon Chio and Ireland’s Alex Denning, who shared the drivers’ crown after a season that saw eight victories and four podium finishes across six countries. Their remarkable consistency and teamwork secured one of the most successful campaigns in the team’s history.

Immediately following their Asia triumph, Leong and Denning competed in the 2025 Lamborghini Super Trofeo World Finals (8–9 November), where the best teams from Asia, Europe and North America vied for global honours. The duo delivered a strong performance, demonstrating the team’s calibre on the international stage and further cementing its reputation among the elite in GT racing.

Ms. Daisy Ho, Managing Director of SJM, said “We are immensely proud to see SJM Theodore Racing claim the 2025 Lamborghini Super Trofeo Asia Championship, bringing glory once again to Macau on the global stage. This victory reflects not only the team’s exceptional professionalism and resilience but also SJM’s long-term commitment to advancing motorsport and nurturing local talent. As we look ahead to the Macau Grand Prix, SJM remains dedicated to promoting Macau as a world-class City of Sports.”

Mr. Teddy Yip Jr., Team Principal of SJM Theodore Racing, remarked, “This season has been one of the finest in our team’s history. To secure both the Drivers’ and Teams’ Championships with races in hand is an outstanding achievement and a testament to the dedication of everyone involved. My sincere thanks go to SJM for their unwavering partnership and to Charles and Alex for their exceptional performances. We now turn our focus to our home race, the 72nd Macau Grand Prix.”

Mr. Charles Leong Hon Chio, reflecting on the significance of the victory, said “I’m very proud of what the team achieved this year. It’s been a tremendous effort from everyone involved, and the results show that teamwork really does make the difference. Next week in Macau, I hope we can do something special. I’ve been racing on the Guia Circuit for many years, so I’m really looking forward to getting back on home ground.”

Mr. Alex Denning added “It’s been a flawless season. We’ve broken many records and I couldn’t be prouder of the whole team. Huge thanks to SJM Theodore Racing, all our sponsors,

and to Charles for an amazing season together. I hope we can carry this success forward into next year.”

Since the series opener in April, SJM Theodore Racing has competed across three continents and six iconic circuits — Sydney, Shanghai, Fuji, Inje, Sepang and Misano — leading the standings throughout the season. The team’s commanding performance has once again elevated Macau’s presence on the international motorsport map.

Following their successful season in Italy, Charles Leong and the SJM Theodore Racing crew return to Macau to join teammates Freddie Slater (United Kingdom) and Rashid Al Dhaheri (United Arab Emirates) for the 72<sup>nd</sup> Macau Grand Prix, taking place from 13 to 16 November.

As the 72<sup>nd</sup> Macau Grand Prix revs up, SJM will continue to stand alongside SJM Theodore Racing, hosting a variety of racing-themed, high-octane community events that impart expert knowledge and celebrate the rich historical legacy of the Macau Grand Prix, further propelling Macau’s development as a true “City of Sports.”
